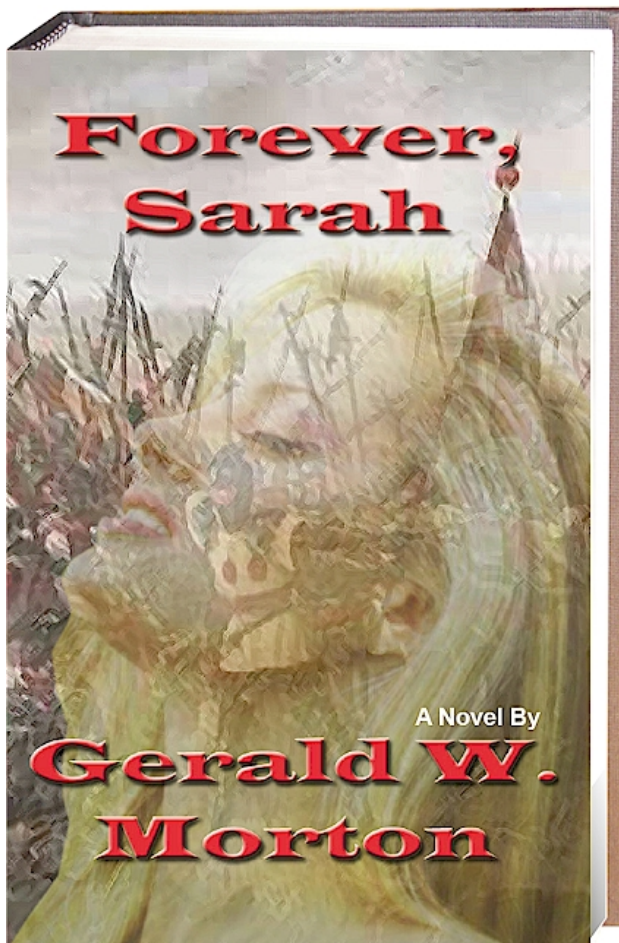

At age 16, Sarah Sexton did not understand the determination of King Charles I to raise his standard in 1642. She was unaware of the reasons that Parliament accepted the challenge and raised an army to prevent the King from asserting his traditional powers as the English sovereign. Her life on a farm in the English midlands had not educated her in such weighty matters of politics and religion. She did, however, know that she had fallen in love with Arthur Tweed, the handsome man of honor who served as an officer of the Cavalier general Prince Rupert.

In May, 2005, Gerald W. Morton retired after 25 years of teaching English at Winthrop College in South Carolina and Auburn Univer-

His retirement ended abruptly in August of 2005 when he accepted a visiting professorship at Emory & Henry College in Virginia, his undergraduate alma mater. After two years at Emory & Henry, he plans to retire completely from teaching and pursue his writing, taking advantage of the rich culture and quiet lifestyle of his new home.
